Between 1977 and 2002 Canterbury Urban Studies Centre (CUSC) and Canterbury Environment Centre (CEC) published around 30 guides and city trails describing various aspects of Canterbury's past. All are now out of print and many are difficult to find (a few impossible) through normal second-hand sources.
